Dear Parents/ Guardians,

September 2018

Another year is upon us and we are excited to be back at school. Thank you for entrusting us with your children and we hope that this year goes well for all of them and for you. Here are some things of note for the coming year:

We hope you come to our **Open House on Tuesday, September 18 from 6:00 – 7:00pm** for K-12.

We are proud to welcome some **new staff members** this year: Kristin Polnik is our High School Student Services teacher, Tristan Sutherland is teaching Gr. 1, Cari Smith is our Reading Recovery Teacher and Andrew DeCock is our new Custodian.

We have gained more than forty students since the spring and we are still adding more each week! Most of this growth has been in Early and Middle Years and will help us maintain a full slate of academic and arts programming going forward. We have grown so much over the summer, that we have been generously approved by the school board to add an additional 1.75 teachers at the Gr. 1 and Gr. 5 levels. (Gr. 1 has been filled and the .75 Gr. 5 will be filled shortly). While we were anticipating some enrollment growth, hiring additional staff can only be considered when students have officially registered.

Our larger school goals for this year continue to be centered around two key concepts:

- 1) Preparing students for an uncertain future where whole categories of jobs, technologies and knowledge are becoming obsolete while others are being created at an incredible pace. We see the teaching of traits like the 6 Cs (Critical Thinking, Creativity, Collaboration, Communication, Character and Citizenship) as perhaps being more applicable and transportable than more traditional methods. You will see more and more learning projects, across all the grades and subjects, that incorporate these elements.
- 2) **Developing** and strengthening in students the **character**, **resilience**, **grit**, **perseverance** and **mindfulness** that will see them not just cope but thrive in this turmoil. Being able to both adapt to new situations and to rebound from setbacks will help them succeed now and in the future. Mme. Giselle Beaupre will continue teaching Character Education in K-8 classrooms.

Students and staff will also be working together to re-affirm our school-wide behaviour expectations. Our "Raiders are Respectful" policy has four main components, Respect for Self, Respect for Others, Respect for the Environment and Respect for Learning. Students are being taught / reminded what these mean and look like in class, in the lunchroom, in hallways, in the gym, on field trips, in assemblies, etc. These four broad areas of respect will be taught and practiced throughout the school - common language and expectations.

Creating a warm, welcoming environment where students K-12 work together and look out for each other is important to us. Of course that is not the experience for every student all of the time. If things are not going well for your child, please let us know early so we can work together to fix things.
