
VC2 Cello Duo was at Killarney School on October 18th to treat us to a very entertaining concert on their Canadian Prairie Debut.



Just heat & serve.

Study Manitoba School Divisions

Over the last 11 years, we have been welcoming students from around the world to the 5 school divisions represented in the Study Manitoba consortium: Beautiful Plains, Fort La Bosse, Rolling River, Southwest Horizon and Turtle Mountain School Divisions. The success of the program relies on the participation of local families to welcome and support these young people as they embark on their academic and cultural programs. What these students choose to do is very brave – they arrive in a new country to meet a new family and new friends, learn about a new country and for many, they do it all in a foreign language. They learn and grow as they go, not just academic and language skills but also in areas of cultural awareness and life experience.

Students choose to study for 3 months, one semester or a full academic year in Canada because it helps them learn more about the world and about themselves. Some families feel international programs give their children an advantage over their peers. Many go on to post secondary education or employment and studying abroad looks great on their applications, either at home or internationally. It is exciting to hear from students as they pursue the pathways towards their career goals. We often hear that they feel their time in Manitoba was "the best time of my life" and how "I can't wait to come back someday".

You may be familiar with the homestay family program or you may be learning about it for the first time. We are always on the lookout for new families to open their homes to incoming students. If you can offer a student a supportive environment and you have a spare bedroom, consider becoming a homestay family. Our homestay families tell us that they have strong connections with their students and they now have "kids" around the world. We appreciate our homestay families so much for the time and care that they give to students.
