



Careers

The calendar has turned, weather is improving and students are again looking for summer employment. Recently, a few parents have reached out to ask about resumes and the Young Readiness Certificate that is now mandated by the government. You can help them get a head start and jump on the competition by asking a few simple questions:

Do they have easy access to a resume they prepared at school?

Is it updated and relevant to any particular employer they plan to approach?

Take a look and make sure it highlights most recent **work experience first**, skills, and volunteer experience. First impressions are important, so make sure it looks good!

Numeracy

Parents introduce literacy to their children by reading together, making meaning from pictures, singing, pointing out letters and sounds, while math exposure often begins and ends with the counting.

University of Chicago professor Susan Levine explains:

"Kids can rattle off their numbers early, often from 1 to 10, and parents are surprised and impressed. But it's a list with no meaning. Learning to count by rote teaches children number words and order, but it does not teach them number sense, any more than singing the letters L-M-N-O-P in the alphabet song teaches phonemic

awareness."

It is important to take the time and engage with your children (at a young age) about more or less. Encourage them to compare similarities and differences by discussing size, shape, and number. Practice estimating while you play with your children and get them make predictions (how many steps to the kitchen).

It is extremely important to make meaning using both letters and numbers so we all can properly communicate, learn, and achieve success.


Cake War #2
