DROP OFF/PICK UP ZONE

The designated drop off/pick up zone is in front of the school, located along King Avenue, between Finlay Street and Fletcher Street.

Students are *NOT* to be dropped off or picked up in either the north or south parking lots between 8:00 am and 4:00 pm.

The safety of our students, staff and guests is of utmost importance to us so we must remind everyone of our pick up/drop off policy, as outlined in our school handbook.

Please <u>do not</u> pick up or drop off your child in either the south staff parking lot or the north school bus parking lot. We do not want students running to vehicles in the parking lot where other vehicles are moving and possibly get hurt. Please arrange to pick up or drop off your child on the sidewalk in front of the school along King Avenue, where they can safely walk in to the school along the sidewalk.

STUDENT LED CONFERENCES MARCH 15 & 16

K-6

Student Led Conferences are a time for students to celebrate their learning. Teachers provide the equivalent of 4 hours for scheduling parents/guardians student led conferences. Generally speaking, times are scheduled from 6:00-8:00 each evening but our early years teachers have often adjusted the time so that it works better for their families. Your student's teacher will reach out with the plan for their class.

Grade 7 & 8

Our grade 7 and 8 classes split their time between multiple teachers. This reporting period, we are going to have our 4 classroom teachers set up in the library from 6:00-8:00 each evening so that families can visit with all teachers. Each student will have one portfolio with work samples from each of their classes. We hope that you will come in and have a look through the portfolio with your student. It is important for students to know that families value their hard work as well. If a teacher would like to meet with a specific family, the teacher will reach out and ask you to book a meeting time. If you do not receive an email but would like to meet with a teacher(s), please call the office (204-523-4696) and the secretaries will schedule a time. Our teachers would love to chat!

High School

For high school students, times can be scheduled between 6:00-8:00 each evening. Parents will have the opportunity of meeting with teachers for a triad conference (parent/guardian - student - teacher) or for a meeting with just the teacher and parent. High school families are asked to call the office (204 -523-4696) to arrange a time with the teachers they wish to meet with. The secretaries will have one google document set up with all high school teachers' names on it and 10 or 20 minute increments. Teachers may also contact parents/guardians to request a meeting.

K-8 REPORT CARDS

Report cards will be emailed home on March 9th. If you need a paper copy, please call or email the office to let them know and one will be printed and available for pick up in the office at the end of the day on March 9th. Here are a few kind suggestions that will make March reporting a productive time of the year:

- Find genuine ways to celebrate your student's efforts enjoy listening to your student explaining their successes and offer praise for their accomplishments and growth.
- Set one or two realistic and achievable goals for the next reporting period and create a plan on how to achieve them.
- If you have questions about your student's report card, please reach out to their teacher and ask for clarity. Positive communication strengthens the education process.
- Remember, grades belong to students, not parents. They are a means by which we can teach personal responsibility, natural consequences, and the value of hard work, good study skills, and positive social skills.
- Resist comparing a student's grades with their siblings or friends. Each student is unique. Our goal is to see individual growth in each student and to praise those accomplishments.

WORK SPACES

This year, we have been working towards creating additional work and conversation areas throughout the school with the addition of comfortable seating and tables. If you have been in the building, you may have noticed benches and now tables across from the office, table and chair units throughout the building, and bar height tables and chairs in the north foyer. It is wonderful to see students enjoying these areas throughout the day.

LIBRARY NEWS


